KNOWING CHRIST

Recently this portion of Esther's mission was mentioned during worship and I began to wonder about the first word, "knowing." Then, the questions came to mind: in what ways are we to know Christ? What would Martin Luther say? Does our modern-day understanding come close to a more ancient understanding of the word, "know?"

If the New Testament didn't exist during the incarnated life of Jesus here on earth, then folks back in the day (or ancient times) would've used their understanding of the Hebrew Scriptures to make sense of knowing God.

And in the Hebrew Bible, the word "know" (or "yada" in Hebrew) has a wide range of meanings: know, learn to know, perceive, discern, distinguish, know by experience, recognize, confess. Each one of the definitions really depends on the context - doesn't it? In other words, how the word is used in a sentence and how that sentence fits in the paragraph and as we zoom out how the person is trying to convey their experience of God through story.

So, for the Israelites, one might tell the story of their oppression under Pharaoh and how God sent not only Moses but a series of plagues to get Pharaoh's attention. The last plague involves putting lamb's blood above the door of each Israelite home as the angel of death passed over (hence Passover) those houses with lamb's blood (they were spared from death). All others including Pharaoh witnessed their first-born children (and livestock) die after the angel of death passed over.

The grief of Pharaoh was so great, that he let God's people go free. Then, he had regrets over that decision and chased after his former slaves to re-enslave them.

At a point that looks like the Israelites are certain to be caught, Moses calls on God and God makes a way through the Red Sea for the Israelites to escape to the other side of the river. In full pursuit, Pharaoh's army chases the escaped slaves. But before they could be captured, the waves of water once held back by God are let go and they quickly consume the army - leaving a wake of destruction behind.

So, how does knowing this story inform the mission of Esther which begins with "Knowing Christ."

What if the Israelites' foundational story of essentially, we were once slaves, until God heard our cries and ultimately freed us from oppression is similar to the foundational story that followers of Christ tell. A story that in broad strokes might go like this, we are all slaves to sin and Christ cried out to God, "forgive them - they don't know what they're doing," and God in Christ forgave us - now nothing can separate us from God's love in Christ Jesus, not even death (and the many ways death is manifested - lies, gossip, and judging others).

What if "Knowing Christ" is deeper and wider like the Hebrew definition of "know?"

Is it possible to perceive Christ where two or three are gathered in Christ's name? Could we learn to experience Christ around the Lord's Supper? May we learn to recognize our need for forgiveness when judging others and hear Christ call to God for forgiveness amidst our fumbling / stumbling attempts to point the finger at others while missing the three pointing back at the accuser?

So, how does God's story connect with your story and with Esther's story? Perhaps listening for and discerning that connection is a place to care for others willing to share their story. And for those a bit more guarded, perhaps it's worth trusting that they'll share their story if they're able to, and when they are willing to, and with whom they feel called to share. And if that conversation eventually occurs, Christ promises to be right there - smack dab in the middle of it.
