Confirmation Mentors . . . What do they do?

That was the question I was asked quite a while back and my off-the-cuff answer was, "mentoring is primarily about relationship . . . being with and connecting with the youth without any agenda . . ."

And to connect without an agenda is to meet another person where they are and "walk with them" or in today's language, "hang out" and get to know them and their "highs" and "lows."

Mentors (and those being mentored) who are intentional about getting together on a weekly or monthly basis recognize the importance of this type of relationship and its impact on cultivating faith. It reminds me of the mortar that connects bricks together . . . hanging out consistently forms that mortar joint between the mentor and young person.

And in routinely getting together, I believe the space is created for young people to share not just their highs and lows but other areas of their lives as well. This might include exploring their faith in terms of what they believe about God (to include their doubts) . . . or even - what God might be calling them to do as followers of Christ. It might mean reading the Bible together or praying together . . . sharing those faith practices that've been life giving to the mentor (or the young person).

In other words, wherever young people are on their faith journey . . . there's an older person they trust walking alongside them . . . willing to share their own stories of faith and even their times of doubt . . . when asked (or when the timing seems right).

So, what do mentors do? They consistently hang out with those they mentor and as they walk together . . . they share stories . . . stories of faith and even doubt . . . and in gathering together in Christ's name . . . Christ is present.

"For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Matthew 18:20).

## **ESTHER WELCA REPORT February 2024**

Our regular meeting was held on Sunday, January 14th at 8:30. There were 4 in attendance. Our Checking Account Balance is \$1,862.07, Memorial/Savings \$9,666.66. We are going to try to get a project to do one a quarter. Suggestions were making Christmas pots, ax throwing, bean bag, mother/daughter/friend get together, and ??? Looking for other ideas.

We for sure would like to plan to make Christmas pots. Asking all women interested to pick up Christmas things on clearance racks or at garage sales that could be put into the pots. We will have a pot party in the fall to put our pots together.

During Covid, the Women of the ELCA started a fund to give women studying to be a pastor a stipend as a little THANK YOU. All 220 churches are asked to donate to it. Esther started with the first \$300. This past fall, a few other churches donated \$675. That \$975 was given out to 4 women studying to be a pastor. Two were in Moorhead, one in Fergus Falls, and one in Alexandria. Each was given \$243.75 to use however they wish.

Invitations were sent out to 87 men in the church directory for the first Men's Night Out. It was held at Herby's in Carlos. 14 of them attended January 31st. We ended up with Mentor Night being the same night so a few of guys were not able to attend. They say they had a good time getting together. We did a small game identifying activities guys do from the table decorations, trying to get them to move around to visit with others. They pretty much stayed at their individual tables.
