BROKEN AND BELOVED

And just like that – here we are in Lent - a favorite time of the year at Esther! We start with Ash Wednesday Worship with Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion, followed by five Wednesdays of soup and sandwich suppers with delicious food, and fellowship time that provides an opportunity to make new bonds and check in on each other. We end these sacred gatherings with our Holden Evening Prayer worship service – we love it and know it oh so well!

This year we will be journeying these forty days to the cross using a series called "Broken and Beloved". Each Wednesday as we gather to worship, our Confirmation students will be sharing stories of God's steadfast love for people from the bible: David, Naomi, Elijah, the Syrophoenician woman, Mary Magdalene, Peter, and Jesus. I invite you to consider following this Lenten devotional journey starting Ash Wednesday. Mandy will be sending out the daily devotions by email, there are paper copies available on the usher table, and I will be posting the devotions for each day on the private FB page "Esther Lutheran". If you would like to join in, search for the page and request to be in the group. This page is not our public Facebook page, but a closed page so people can share in a safe place, where we can lift up and encourage one another in faith.

As we go through these 40 days of lent, let us take time to dwell in the word of God revealed through the scriptures. Let us spend some time reflecting on our lives, our blessings, our callings. Let us give thanks to God who sent us Jesus, to take away our sin, and show

us God's love and how to share that same love with one another. It is difficult to ever completely comprehend what Jesus did for us on the cross. His death for our sins. His resurrection, for our eternal life.

Let us take time each of these 40 days to really enjoy some quiet time with God. I feel like we are always so busy and take for granted and push aside the one who loves us the most. Many times we tend to turn to God in our times of brokenness - when we sin, in our grief, in our desperation or fear, or when we wrestle with our own demons. Let us not wait for those moments. Through spiritual practices such as this devotional – or another devotional you may find more for you - we can learn to not just cling to God in our times of trial, but have daily hearts of gratitude and daily time with God. We can reflect on how God is calling us. Reflect on some what-ifs. What if - I took a breath and didn't try to force things to be the way that I want, but be still and listen for where the Holy Spirit is leading. What if -My calling right now is to mentor the next generation coming up, sharing my knowledge and stories to encourage others in their call and their faith. What if - I am being nudged to reach out to someone who may need to hear about Jesus.

I hope you will join us each day in the Lenten journey and take some special time each day with God, and to dwell in scripture and prayer with the one who loves you the most.
