We will be meeting Tuesdays June 3, June 10 and June 17 at 5:30 pm, to plan, prep and build what is needed for an awesome VBS experience for all involved.

We also invite the community to a Cookout and Worship on the final evening, Wednesday, June 25, at 5:30 pm. We will be grilling, so bring a dish to share and join in the fellowship and fun. A joyous worship will start at 6:30 pm, and afterwards the kids will show you what they have been up to at VBS this year. We pray the "village" will be there to share a meal, join in worship, and support these great kids and volunteers!



The Esther Lutheran Cemetery Board members are planning on purchasing spruce/pine trees to put in on the west side of the cemetery this fall. At this time they do not know what the price per tree will be, but thinking around \$300. They are looking at putting in around 20-30 trees. It was discussed at the annual meeting that if a person is interested in donating money to be put towards this project that donations can be made out to the Esther Lutheran Cemetery Fund.





WELCA met on May 4th at 8:30. This was one week earlier than normal because of schedule conflicts. We have \$7,443.14 in our saving/memorial fund and \$1,881.30 in our checking account.

Synod Convention is going to be September 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> at First Lutheran in Alexandria. Plans are well underway for it. We do need a voting representative yet.

### **Esther Lutheran's Cemetery**

Flowers were put on all the graves Sunday, May 18th after church. There were several people working to get flowers on every grave in the cemetery. Dennis Rosenguist supplied pizza for all those who helped. The cemetery is beautiful with all the flowers. We have been reusing many flowers as long as we can from donations from you the congregation. Since starting this about 6 years ago, we are having to throw a number of them away each year. We are hoping if you see a good deal on flowers, you would purchase and donate to the Cemetery Flower Fund. If you have put flowers on your family's grave and it is still on when the flowers need to be removed in June; we will take them off and add to the flowers we have for the graves. Many of you have asked what product has been used on the cemetery stones to clean them. The picture above is one of the stones that has changed significantly. This is 3 years of the product Wet & Forget It doing its magic. No scrubbing, just spray it on and let the product work. As you look around the cemetery, there are very few that still have black and green moss on them. We have tried to put a coat of this product on the stones that need it each year to get them cleaned. This product works with the rain, snow or wind removing the residue from the stones. Typically, putting a coat on in the fall so the winters weather help remove a great deal of the buildup. (you can purchase this product from home use at Menards, Ace Hardware, and Wal-Mart)


