Whenever I think of November I tend to want to jump right to Thanksgiving, which is my favorite holiday, when we gather and catch up with loved ones and enjoy lots of delicious food. However, before we get to the turkey and family gatherings, this month at Esther offers us many opportunities to gather together as a faith community. Opportunities to worship together, learn together, share together and serve together. We are fortunate to be part of a congregation that supports and cares for each other. But how does that look beyond the close-knit community of Esther?

I recently attended the Mental Health First Aid training put on by the NWMN Synod and a quote used that really stuck with me was when the instructor shared that a lot of the problems in this world are because, "we have forgotten that we belong to each other". He was speaking of how our culture tends to teach us to focus on independence and individualism, which in part has led to feelings of isolation and loneliness, resulting in additional mental health issues. I looked up the full quote by Mother Teresa and found this: "Today, if we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other—that man, that woman, that child is my brother or my sister. If everyone could see the image of God in his neighbor, do you think we would still need tanks and generals?"

That quote has hung with me these past few weeks as I watch the news, attend community events, and engage in conversations. That quote has been with me as I visit with those who grieve, those having health concerns, those struggling financially, relationally or spiritually. That quote reminds me of how intertwined our lives are, and how our words and actions can reflect God's love. Or not. Have we forgotten that we belong to each other? Do we see God in our neighbor? Does our neighbor see God in us?

As we celebrated Affirmation of Baptism for two of our young people, that quote snuck into my mind as we affirmed our baptismal call - to live among God's faithful people, to come together to hear the word of God and share in Holy Communion, to proclaim the good news of God through word and deed, to serve all people following Jesus' example, and to strive for justice and peace.

How do our baptismal promises play out in the world each day as we go about our lives? Do they show up in the way we care for our families and our neighbors near and far? We may think that the problems that others are having are not our problems, if they don't directly affect us. We pray for the world in the "Prayers of the People", but what is it that we do about these issues as the hands and feet of Jesus?

Inside this newsletter you will see multiple invitations to come together and remember that we are one in Christ. Already this month, a group of people gathered to make porch pots for community members. Another group came together to provide service and care for a member's end of life service. Coming up this month you can: collect food and funds to support our local neighbors in need, gather together to give thanks to God as a whole community, share in stories of faith and life in Bible Study, Sunday School, 3X3 Group and Confirmation, share crafts or help make food items and invite people to attend our Christmas Market event to help our WELCA raise funds for multiple charities and partner ministries in our community. These are some opportunities to help us gather together and remember that we belong to one another. What other ideas might the Holy Spirit be prompting you to share? Who might the Holy Spirit be nudging you to invite? How might the Holy Spirit be guiding you to care for your neighbor near and far?

As we end the liturgical church year and start the new year with Advent later this month, let us think about the coming year and how we might live out our baptismal call, sharing our blessings and gifts for the good of all, and come together to remember and give thanks that we belong to one another in Christ. WELCA met on October 12, 2025, at 8:30. Bev reported we had \$7,513.81 in the memorial/savings fund. There is \$1,797.62 in the checking account. We had devotions and read our WELCA statement. Luella relayed information from the Fall Conference Meeting that was held at Messiah Lutheran in Hoffman on October 11th. The speaker, Betty McBrady Thomes, was extremely interesting as her sister has been in Zambia working with kids on the streets for many years. Her family helps raise money and they reach out to everyone to pray for their needs. God has been answering prayers for 25 years. She has been there long enough, so the government is now asking her how to do things to help the kids on the streets. In Zambia, the boy children are pretty much put out on the streets. The girls are kept as they can be sold as a dowry to be married. She has been long enough where some of the first boys she had helped when she first started are now returning from college to help also.

Esther WELCA hosted a table at the Domestic Violence Luncheon that was held October 15th at the Broadway Ballroom. Linda & Jim Arvidson, Donna Pederson, Megan & Jewel Townsend, Sue Ellwanger, and Luella attended this year. In 2024 there were 27 women, men, and babies murdered in domestic violence instances. We ALL need to be aware of people around us that might need help... it might be your next-door neighbor!

Because the WELCA does not have enough funds to help support all the charities we normally help, especially at Christmas time, we are hosting a Soup/Sandwich Lunch and Christmas Market. This will be held on December 7<sup>th</sup> from 11 am-2 pm. There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex to sign to provide a large pot of one of your favorite soups to share. On the sheet is also sign up for some barbecue. We are just doing two kinds of sandwiches ... barbecues and a hot turkey. We hope you also have some crafts, baked goods, canned goods, that you could also donate for the Christmas Market. Invite your family and friends! There are some posters on the table in the Narthex if you could help hang up in in the surrounding area.

On November 1st a group of ladies got together to make Christmas porch pots at Kathy Mittags. These

were given to members of our community who have been on our prayer list or experienced a loss or hardship in the past year. We had a good time and lots of supplies were gathered to assemble some beautiful Porch Pots. Most were outdoor creations, but we did do some indoor pots for those who live in apartments, and a few cups too out of artificial greens.

Because the WELCA nationwide is down, we are short on funds to meet the budget. If you have extra funds, you could help support the WELCA, please contact Bev, Lana, or Luella for information on where to send it. You could also write a check to our WELCA and we could do one check from our account.

Martha Circle worked at Sarah Pomeranz's funeral on Thursday, November 6th. We appreciate all those who helped set up, serve, and provided cakes and funds.

It also provides technical assistance, training opportunities and accompaniment through the relief and recovery stages. Additionally, Lutheran Disaster Response works with communities in disaster preparedness, mitigation and resilience. Lutheran Disaster Response abides by the principles of accompaniment, walking together in a solidarity that practices interdependence and mutuality. Every disaster is local, and local communities and organizations are best-equipped to address needs following a disaster.

**Hurricane Response** 



The situation: As predicted, the 2025 Atlantic hurricane season has been above average in the

number and intensity of its storms. Whatever unfolds this season, Lutheran Disaster Response will be there.

With strong relationships in the United States, in the Caribbean and around the world, Lutheran Disaster Response is already at work on the
